
Gentlemen:

Dear Mr. Lynch:

Your letter of February 9, 1970, was considered at the regular meeting of the Board of Harbor Commissioners of the San Mateo County Harbor District February 19, 1970.

It is our understanding that the City of Half Moon Bay, the County of San Mateo, the Granada Sanitary District, the San Mateo County Harbor District and the United States Government through the Corps of Army Engineers is each working to find some solution to the problem of erosion east of the breakwater at Pillar Point Harbor.

I have been authorized by the Board of Harbor Commissioners to assure you that the San Mateo County Harbor District will cooperate to the greatest extent possible to find a solution to the problem and is most certainly receptive to the idea of taking such remedial action as is necessary to preserve not only the Granada Sanitary District Pump Station, but also other property in the vicinity.

We agree that there is little point in protracted litigation, since it is in the best interests of all concerned to find a satisfactory solution to the problem without unnecessary expenditure of taxpayers' money.





Dear Mr. Eppler:

This is to advise you that we have canceled our permit applications for the proposed seawall project to provide protection to State Route 1 in El Granada.

We were unable to find a mutually acceptable solution on sources of sand to meet California Coastal Commission's permit condition requiring Caltrans to replenish the beach area with the sand dredged from Pillar Point Harbor, in accordance with the Department of Fish and Game's recommendations.

As an alternate solution to provide protection to the State highway, we are now exploring the possibility of relocating the highway further away from the eroding coastline.

We are anticipating that the feasibility study for possible highway relocation will be completed before the end of this year.
