Congratulations to Commissioner Tom Mattusch for being elected at the January 18 meeting to his second term as President by his fellow Commissioners, to Commissioner Chang Kiraly for her second term as Vice-President, and to Commissioners Bernardo and Larenas as Secretary and Treasurer respectively. The minutes will be published next week, but no action on 'Rates and Fees' and '2017 Goals and Objectives' will come back for further discussion on February 15.

Lots of activity this month at the District:

Next week, Wednesday 2/8 at 2:00 a special meeting to look at the proposed sidewalk project, parking lot and ADA improvements at Pillar Point Harbor. The meeting will be held on site, meeting at the Harbormaster's office at the base of the Johnson Pier. Please join us and provide input and ideas.

Then, on Wednesday 2/15, at the District office in El Granada, we will be having a study session on Oyster Point Marina and Park, as we look at our future in light of the very interesting development proposals for the immediate area. This will be held at the District office, starting at 4:00 and followed by our regular meeting at 6:30.

And, on Wednesday 2/22, the Board will be conducting an all day workshop on strategic plan development. This too will be held at the District office, and probably starting at 8:30 a.m.

Not done yet! Then on March 1, we will be reconvening for the Board to discuss the results of the Pillar Point site visit and discussion, and guide the consultant on next steps.
