SUBJECT: General Manager's Activity Report for December 2024/January 2025

1. On December 18, 2024 received a request from OneShoreline for a letter of support for their application to the SB1 Sea Level Rise Adaptation Planning Grant Program of the California Ocean Protection Council for the Brisbane Area Shoreline Resilience Project. This project will create a comprehensive shoreline resilience plan for low-lying lands, infrastructure, coastal habitats, and vulnerable open spaces for the entire shoreline of Brisbane, as well as adjacent shoreline areas of South San Francisco to Point San Bruno that includes the San Mateo County Harbor District's highly vulnerable Oyster Point Marina. On December 18, 2024, a letter of support was drafted and shared with the President of the Harbor Commission. No objection to the letter was received and on December 19, 2024, the Letter of Support was signed and shared with OneShoreline. [Letter is Attached](#). This is a great opportunity for the District to be part of a team to address sea level rise at Oyster Point under a system approach, will all potential solutions working together to address sea level rise.
2. On December 19, 2024, the General Manager, Operations Manager, Commissioner Mattusch, and Commission Domurat met with the U.S. Army Corps to discuss the Princeton Shoreline Project under the CAP 111 program. A separate staff report on this meeting has been prepared and is being presented to the Board at the January 15, 2025 Regular meeting.
3. Attended the California Maritime Affairs and Navigation Conference Washington D.C. pre-meeting.
4. WRDA-2024 was signed into law on January 4, 2025 by President Biden. The Pillar Point Sea Level Rise Study was included in the Bill. It is important to note that WRDA-2024 only provides authorization to the ACOE to conduct the study, the study and resulting work still need funding. This project has the potential to positively impact the coastline from Pillar Point Harbor to Pilarcitos Creek in Half Moon Bay.
