General Definition:

The San Mateo County Harbor District is seeking a highly qualified and dedicated individual to serve as Deputy Harbormaster. Under general direction of the Assistant Harbormaster, performs a variety of operational, maintenance, repair, safety, security and public information activities in support of the facility. As first point of contact with the public, the Deputy Harbormaster is responsible for ensuring the public's safe and enjoyable facility use.

Deputy Harbormaster A:

This is the entry-level class in the Deputy Harbormaster series. Initially under close supervision, incumbents will perform basic duties. As experience is gained, assignments become more varied and are performed with greater independence. Work is usually supervised while in progress and fits an established structure or pattern. Exceptions or changes in procedures are explained in detail as they arise. Eventually, incumbents will attain a level of experience to receive only occasional instruction or assistance as new or unusual situations arise and where they are fully aware of the operational procedures and work. This class is alternately staffed with the Deputy Harbormaster B and incumbents may advance to the higher-level class after gaining the knowledge, skills, and experience that meet the qualifications for and by consistently demonstrating the ability to perform the work of the higher-level class. Deputy Harbormaster A Education/Experience:

An Associate of Arts Degree in Fire Science or Law Enforcement obtained from an accredited college or university is desirable. Courses from non-accredited institutions will not be evaluated for this requirement. Experience: A minimum of six (6) months' service in the capacity of Harbor Worker B preferred, or comparable experience.

License And/Or Certificates:

Possession of or ability to obtain and maintain a valid Class C California driver's license at time of employment. Completion of Penal Code 832 Law Enforcement Training, within first year of employment. Completion of Marine Fires, Department of Boating and

Waterways training within first year of employment. Completion of a valid Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Adult, Child, One and Two Person and Standard First Aid training and receipt of certificate within first year of employment. Completion of HAZWOPER-24 training and receipt of certificate. Completion of the California Boating Safety Course within first year of employment.

Deputy Harbormaster B:

This is the full journey-level class in the series. Incumbents at this level are capable of performing the full range of advanced duties. Incumbents at this level receive only occasional instruction or assistance as new or unusual situations arise and are fully aware of operational procedures. May provide technical and functional supervision of lower-level staff. This class is distinguished from the Assistant Harbormaster in that the latter is responsible for the supervision of staff and is capable of performing the most complex duties and assignments. Deputy Harbormaster B Education/Experience:

A minimum of twenty-four (24) months service in the capacity of Deputy Harbormaster A or comparable position or experience AND the License/Certificates listed below.

License And/Or Certificates:

All license/certificate requirements for Deputy Harbormaster A. Completion of the following Department of Boating and Waterways training: Boating Skills Operations, Boating Safety and Enforcement – Basic, Rescue Boat Operations, and Coastal Piloting and Navigation.

Working Conditions:

May be required to work various shifts including early mornings, evenings, weekends, and holidays.
