The San Mateo County Harbor District has a full-time employment opportunity with excellent benefits for a Deputy Harbormaster. Under general direction of the Assistant Harbormaster, performs a variety of operational, maintenance, repair, safety, security, and public information activities in support of the facility. As first point of contact with the public, the Deputy Harbormaster is responsible for ensuring the public's safe and enjoyable facility use.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

Receives direct or general supervision from the Harbormaster and Harbormaster Assistant. Exercises direct supervision over Harbor Workers.

Deputy Harbormaster A

This is the entry-level class in the Deputy Harbormaster series. Initially under close supervision, incumbents will perform basic duties. As experience is gained, assignments become more varied and are performed with greater independence. Work is usually supervised while in progress and fits an established structure or pattern. Exceptions or changes in procedures are explained in detail as they arise. Eventually, incumbents will attain a level of experience to receive only occasional instruction or assistance as new or unusual situations arise and where they are fully aware of the operational procedures and work. This class is alternately staffed with the Deputy Harbormaster B and incumbents may advance to the higher-level class after gaining the knowledge, skills, and experience that meet the qualifications for and by consistently demonstrating the ability to perform the work of the higher-level class. Qualified Candidates will possess the following:

Education:

- An Associate of Arts Degree in Fire Science or Law Enforcement obtained from an accredited college or university is desirable. Courses from non-accredited institutions will not be evaluated for this requirement.

Experience:

- A minimum of six (6) months' service in the capacity of Harbor Worker B preferred, or comparable experience.

LICENSES OR CERTIFICATIONS

- Possession of or ability to obtain and maintain a valid Class C California driver's license at time of employment.
- Completion of Penal Code 832 Law Enforcement Training, within first year of employment.
- Completion of Marine Fires
- Department of Boating and Waterways training within first year of employment.

- Completion of a valid Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Adult, Child, One and Two Person and Standard First Aid training and receipt of certificate within first year of employment.
- Completion of HAZWOPER-24 training and receipt of certificate.
- Completion of the California Boating Safety Course within first year of employment.

May be required to work various shifts including early mornings, evenings, weekends, and holidays.

Written and Performance Examination: Wednesday, May 12, 2021

- The San Mateo County Harbor District will supply all testing materials.
- The entire process will take approximately 7-8 hours.

Performance Test

- Timed one-mile run
- 150-yard cold saltwater swim (Swimsuits only, no wet suits, goggles, or fins allowed)
- Lifting up to 50 pounds
- Boat handling skills

Oral Interviews: Thursday, May 13, 2021

Top candidates will be invited to return for scheduled Oral Panel interviews on May 13, 2021. If needed, we will extend interviews to Friday, May 14, 2021.
