The Position:

The San Mateo County Harbor District is seeking a highly qualified and dedicated individual to serve as Deputy Harbormaster. This position is an entry level position to assist the Harbormaster in day to day function and responsibilities. This is a hands-on position.

Deputy Harbormaster A:

This is the entry-level class in the Deputy Harbormaster series. Initially under close supervision, incumbents will perform basic duties. As experience is gained, assignments become more varied and are performed with greater independence. Work is usually supervised while in progress and fits an established structure or pattern. Exceptions or changes in procedures are explained in detail as they arise. Eventually, incumbents will attain a level of experience to receive only occasional instruction or assistance as new or unusual situations arise and where they are fully aware of the operational procedures and work. This class is alternately staffed with the Deputy Harbormaster B and incumbents may advance to the higher-level class after gaining the knowledge, skills, and experience that meet the qualifications for and by consistently demonstrating the ability to perform the work of the higher-level class.

Education/Experience:

An Associate of Arts Degree in Fire Science or Law Enforcement obtained from an accredited college or university is desirable. Courses from non-accredited institution will not be evaluated for this requirement. Experience: A minimum of six (6) months' service in the capacity of Harbor Worker B.

License and/or Certificates:

Possession of or ability to obtain and maintain a valid Class C California driver's license at time of employment. A variety of licenses and certificates are required within the first year of employment. See application package and job specifications for details.

Knowledge:

Ability to communicate in English, knowledge of basic marine safety practice and techniques; safe boating operations and search and rescue techniques and knowledge of basic arithmetical calculations.

Physical Demands:

Requires sitting, standing, walking on level, uneven and slippery surfaces. Must possess mobility to work in the field; strength, stamina and mobility to perform medium to heavy physical work, to work in confined spaces and around machines, to climb and descend ladders, and to operate varied hand and power tools and equipment; vision to read printed materials and a computer screen; and hearing and speech to communicate in person and over the telephone or radio. Ability to bend, stoop, kneel, reach, and climb to perform work and inspect work sites. Employees must possess the ability to lift, carry, push and pull material and objects weighing up to 60 pounds, or heavier weights with assistance or the use of proper equipment. Pass a test that includes physical activities including swimming.

Working Conditions:

May be required to work various shifts including early mornings, evenings, weekends, and holidays.
