Mavericks: so, a couple of things – as you may have heard, the World Surf League will be running the contest and received their Coastal Development Permit in December, so now it's up to the ocean to provide the necessary conditions. Also, congratulations to Deputy Harbormaster Ben Andrews, who has made the roster for the 2018 contest as one of the 'local wildcards'. Also, for those interested in the redevelopment of the docks (F, G and H) on the east side of Johnson Pier at Pillar Point Harbor, watch for a notice soon about a public workshop seeking input from users, tenants and others.

Romeo Pier: the District executed a contract in 2017 with the Dutra Group for demolition of the Romeo Pier. Due to their very heavy work load, we then negotiated a considerable cost savings by agreeing to postpone the work until early 2018. We will let you know before any works starts.



Oyster Point – the big development by the marina seems to be off to a slow start, but as things develop, I'll let you know. Look for big changes in 2018.
